

Guardian Life Insurance Offers Scholarship Program for Young Female Entrepreneurs

The Guardian Life Insurance Company of America has announced its 2002/2003 Girls Going Places College Scholarship Program, a national competition designed to recognize and reward teen-aged girls who demonstrate exceptional entrepreneurship. Guardian designed the annual program to help women create, invest, and protect wealth by honoring girls between the ages of 12 and 16 who are taking the first steps toward financial independence.

Guardian and Girls Going Places will award 15 girls a total of \$30,000 to be used toward their college education. Three top scholarship prizes of \$10,000, \$5,000, and \$3,000 and twelve finalist prizes of \$1,000 each will be awarded. Adults may nominate girls -- who could be their daughter, niece, neighbor, or student -- by submitting an essay on why the nominee deserves a Girls Going Places award. Nominees should: demonstrate entrepreneurship and/or financial acumen; have taken the first steps toward financial independence; make a difference in their school, community, or in other people's lives; and show potential for future success.
