

Princeton University's Woodrow Wilson School of Public & International Affairs offers a Junior Summer Institute (JSI) for students of color who are juniors in college.

The Junior Summer Institute is intended to encourage students of color to enter graduate schools of public and international affairs and to pursue careers in public service.

The JSI is a 7 week program held from mid-June to early August and includes both classroom work and extracurricular activities.

The classroom courses are statistics, economics, domestic affairs policy module and international affairs policy module. The extracurricular activities include lectures by leading policy practitioners and site visits to observe public policy in action. Students have visited: The United Nations, Ellis Island, The Coalition of Minority Public Policy Professionals' Conference, and various community development corporations. Apart from the great curriculum and activities, Princeton fully funds each student who is accepted to the program and provides financial support for the total cost of all courses and textbooks, on-campus meal plan and a meal allowance for breakfast and weekend meals, access to Princeton University's libraries, athletic facilities and health services, a single room dormitory, domestic travel expenses required to get to Princeton and then to go home again, and finally, a \$1,000 stipend which may be used at the student's discretion.
