The Southern California Chinese Lawyers' Association (SCCLA) annually awards five \$1,000 scholarships and three \$1,500 fellowships to local Asian/Pacific American law students. The scholarships and the fellowships are awarded based on need, academic accomplishments, and potential contribution to the Chinese-American community. Law students at all levels are encouraged to apply (including first, third year day and fourth year evening). Each fellowship award funds a clerkship at the Asian Pacific American Legal Center during the upcoming school year, fall, winter and spring terms preferred. Receipt of fellowship funds is conditioned upon serving as a clerk at the Center for a minimum of 10-15 hours per week for an entire semester. If the awardee qualifies for the Work/Study Program, there may be an additional supplement to the \$1,500 fellowship.

Completed applications are due on February 25, 2002. Applications must be postmarked by February 25, 2002 to be eligible.

**2003-2004 POSTDOCTORAL AND VISITING SCHOLAR FELLOWSHIPS IN
ASIAN AMERICAN STUDIES AND ETHNIC STUDIES AT UCLA, AND
SELECTION OF DR. ELIZAH NOH AS POSTDOCTORAL FELLOW FOR 2002-
2003**

The UCLA Asian American Studies Center will again offer a fellowship for 2003-2004 to a postdoctoral scholar in support of research or creative activity on Asian Pacific Americans. The fellowship ranges from \$27,000 to \$32,000 per year plus health benefits and up to \$4,000 in research support. The fellowship can be awarded for less than a year in which case the stipend is adjusted to the length of the award, and can be used to supplement sabbatical salaries. The acceptance of the fellowship carries with it the commitment to make a contribution to the research activities of the Center, along with the teaching of one course and a presentation in the Center's faculty colloquium series.
