The Galbraith Scholars program is a special summer offering for undergraduates (principally rising juniors and seniors) with strong intellectual interests in issues of inequality and social policy. The program aims especially to introduce promising minority students and students of limited economic means to educational and career opportunities in the field.

Note: Undergraduates who will be entering their junior or senior year of college in the fall of 2002 are eligible to apply.

Students graduating this year (spring 2002) may also be considered if space permits.

Application for selection requires the following items:

Biographical information (pp. 1-2)

List of prior courses pertaining to inequality and social policy (p. 3)

An essay discussing your interests in issues of inequality and social policy and your future aspirations in this domain (p.4)

Letter of recommendation from a faculty member (p. 5)

PLUS undergraduate transcript

PLUS (optional) a one-page resume

The Southeast Asian Studies Summer Institute (SEASSI)

The Southeast Asian Studies Summer Institute (SEASSI) will offer 8-week intensive summer Heritage language and culture classes in Khmer, Lao, Hmong and Vietnamese. The classes will take place at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, from June 16 to August 8, 2003.

These classes are intended for Hmong, Lao, Cambodian and Vietnamese university students who grew up in North America and can speak/understand the language of their Southeast Asian culture but would like to learn to read and write their language as well. Students will have a chance to learn more about the traditions of the culture and how to make sense of their lives and traditions in America/Canada in an historical context. Independent, project-oriented study opportunities will also be available, in the context of modular instruction, so students who enter the program at an intermediate literacy level can also have their educational needs met and be stimulated and challenged.

The classes are taught by experienced instructors from the United States, Canada and Southeast Asia, and make use of the latest teaching materials and methods.
